What is Mediation?

Mediation is a voluntary and confidential process in which a neutral mediator helps people find a win-win solution to their conflict.



Mediation lets people speak for themselves and make their own choices.

What is the Baltimore City Employee Mediation Project?

The Baltimore City Employee Mediation Project is a joint partnership between the City and the Community Mediation Program, designed to resolve conflicts in the workplace between employees, as well as between employees and supervisors. The City's mediators have been professionally trained through classroom instruction, apprenticeship, a series of evaluations and continuing education.



Why should you consider mediation?

Mediation allows you to control the outcome. No one tells you what to do. All participants develop solutions to meet everyone's needs. A plan is developed that is in the best interest of both parties.

Getting to Mediation

You can contact the Baltimore City Employee Mediation Project, by self-referral, or through our Union partners, AFSCME, Local 44 and the Clty Union of Baltimore (CUB). Your agency HR officer can also make a referral for you.

A representative from the Baltimore City Mediation Project will contact all participants to arrange for a mediation session.

The actual mediation session takes approximately two hours. Additional sessions may be scheduled if necessary.

Long-term resolutions are developed in mediation. These resolutions can be put into a written agreement if the participants choose.
